- Describe, explain, evaluate, and compare the viticultural, winemaking, and legislative options involved in the production of wines from these principal regions and explain how they influence the style, quality, and price of wines from the principal wine regions. vineyard management options and how the influence grape production and resulting style, quality, and price of wine.

Study Guide

Students who have previously registered for Unit D1 have access to the D3 material through their online classroom for 3 years from the time of initial registration.

Exam

Students will write four sets of exams over a two-day period. Exams are held on different days and are based on the information contained within the Study Guide

Unit D3 Theory Exam:

AM: 3 essay-style theory questions (2 hours) PM: 2 essay style theory questions (80 minutes) An aggregate grade of 55% from all 5 questions required to pass this exam

Unit D3 Tasting Exam:

AM: 2 flights of 3 wines tasted blind (90 minutes) PM: 2 flights of 3 wines tasted blind (90 minutes) An aggregate grade of 55% from all 4 flights of wines is required to pass this exam

The exams are then couriered to WSET head office for marking. Results are released approximately 12 weeks after the exam. Students must pass both the Theory Exam and the Tasting Exam to pass Unit D3.
